# **Governance Standing Group Report** to the CUSC Panel 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2005

### **Summary**

Since the June Meeting, when the GSG was re-established with new terms of reference, it will have met four times. On 12<sup>th</sup> July it considered the implications of the new Appeals Procedures and on 4<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> August it specifically assessed CAPs 100,101,102,and 103, that were proposed by National Grid as a direct result of the previous GSG discussions in order to fully implement the Appeals Procedures within CUSC. The GSG were also charged with reviewing Section 8 of the CUSC and it has identified a number of areas where further debate is required, which may in time lead to further CAPs being brought forward. The meeting on 19<sup>th</sup> September would focus on this wider review.

## **Progress on the CAPs**

CAPs 100/101 – The Working Group assessment has been completed and the report is presented at this CUSC Panel Meeting.

CAP102 – Following a brief assessment and the recommendation of the WG, the Proposer has sought to withdraw this proposal.

CAP103 - The Working Group assessment has been completed and the report is presented at this CUSC Panel Meeting.

# **Progress on the Wider Review**

Having identified a number of areas for discussion, the GSG Members agreed to prioritise the review of Section 8 into the following order:

- Filter mechanism for CAP Submissions
- Limitation on number of Working Group Alternative Amendments (WGAA)
- What constitutes a WGAA?
- Treatment of pending proposals in the new Appeals Process
- Process timescales
- Alternate's Votes
- Role of Working Group Chairman
- Independent CUSC Panel Chairman

At the 31<sup>st</sup> August meeting, the GSG begun discussions on the first three items. This was in the hope that it could quickly identify ways of reducing the potential for a plethora of Alternative Amendments being brought forward, be it through introducing a filtering process, limiting the number of Alternatives that can be put forward or strengthening existing provisions. No solution was found at that time; the group in fact agreed that the current process could be the most efficient and effective.

## **Further Update**

The CUSC Panel will be updated on any further progress following the GSG meeting on Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September.

#### **Terms of Reference**

The Amendment Panel is asked to agree that the Group's TOR is further amended to that of only reviewing Section 8.
