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2 Minutes of Previous Meeting

3 New CUSC Modification Proposals

There was one new CUSC Modifications Proposals presented to the CUSC Panel this month.

CMP266: Removal of Demand TNUoS charging as a barrier to future elective Half Hourly settlement. This proposal seeks to prevent double charging of TNUoS for a meter electing to be HH settled, all demand within Measurement Class F & G will be charged under the TNUoS NHH methodology from April 2017 up until HH settlement is mandatory for all consumers.

The Panel reviewed the proposal and agreed that it should be developed by a Workgroup working to a standard timetable.

4 CUSC Modifications Panel Recommendation Vote

CMP255 'Revised definition of the upper limit of Generation Charges in the charging methodology with removal of the reference to the 27% charging cap'

CMP255 aims to remove the requirement for the generation allocation of costs to revert back to 27% if the limits to generation charges imposed by European Commission Regulations no longer apply.

The Panel voted on CMP255 against the Applicable CUSC Objectives. The Panel agreed by majority that the WACM1 proposed under CMP255 better facilitates the CUSC Objectives than the Baseline.
