



Many other areas dry, early freezing fog lifting but remaining very cold. Cloudier in southern England and south Wales; a little light snow possible in the breezier southwest. Tonight: Snow showers affecting some northeastern coastal areas of the UK, many inland areas dry and very frosty. Southern areas cloudier, with intermittent snow possible, chiefly in parts of southwest England.
