



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Very strong winds across the northeast easing this morning, whilst scattered heavy showers and sunny spells affect the north of Scotland. Cloudier across Northern Ireland, southern Scotland and northern England with showers then rain. Dry and bright in the south. Tonight: Frost in parts of Northern Scotland, then cloud and rain moving east across northern areas. Variable cloud and clear intervals further south with some rain for western hills.
