



Chilly in the northeast with low cloud, drizzle and hill fog. Some sunny spells, mainly across northwestern parts. Tonight: Further rain for Northern Ireland, Wales and southern England, whilst low cloud and drizzle affects eastern areas. Mostly dry elsewhere, and winds easing in the south.
