



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Any mist and low cloud clearing leaving plenty of hot and sunny weather. Isolated heavy, thundery showers developing during afternoon, particularly for the East Midlands. Northern Ireland and W Scotland cloudier with some rain developing later, perhaps heavy Northern Ireland. Tonight: Cloud and patchy rain will continue to affect the far northwest of Scotland. Elsewhere, variable cloud with the risk of further isolated heavy showers and thunderstorms. Another very warm night.
