



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Wednesday could see some disruption due to heavy rain and very strong winds, with the arrival of storm Agnes. Drier, with lighter winds in the southeast. Temperatures above normal. Tonight: Largely dry with clear spells and light winds across the south, with some mist and fog patches forming here and there. Showers continuing in the north but becoming mostly dry after midnight. Winds strengthening across the far west by dawn.

Some roads and bridges are likely to close - There is a small chance of injuries and danger to life that could occur from large waves and beach material being thrown onto sea fronts, coastal roads and properties, with a chance of some minor flooding of coastal roads Yellow warning of rain Areas affected: Central, Tayside & Fife Grampian SW Scotland, Lothian Borders Strathclyde Starts: 15:00 BST on Wed 27 SeptemberEnds: 23:59 BST on Wed 27 September A period of heavy rain during Wednesday afternoon and evening may cause some flooding in a few places
