



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: Cloudy with outbreaks of rain moving north-eastwards across Northern Ireland, North Wales and northern England into Scotland through the day. Generally drier and brighter elsewhere, with some warm spells of sunshine developing. Tonight: Rain continue to affect much of Scotland, becoming heavy and persistent in the west. Elsewhere dry with clear spells and some patchy low cloud or fog patches across the south.
