



Areas of rain will slowly become less persistent across northern and northeastern areas. Elsewhere there will be some sunshine and a scattering of showers, heavy at times Tonight: Patchy rain continuing in the far northeast with some showers in the west. Clear spells developing in places ahead of a band of rain spreading northeastwards from the southwest.
