## Energy Act 2023 Section 170(1) and (3)

Notice of statutory consultation on proposed modifications to industry codes to implement the Independent System Operator and Planner (ISOP)
- excluding proposed modifications relating to National Security

- 1. The Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ('the Authority')<sup>1</sup> proposes to modify the following industry codes (collectively referred to as "the Codes") pursuant to section 169 of the Energy Act 2023:
  - Balancing and Settlement Code (BSC)
  - Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC)
  - Distribution Code (D-Code)
  - Distribution Connection and Use of System Agreement (DCUSA)
  - Grid Code
  - System Operator Transmission Owner Code (STC)
  - Security and Quality of Supply Standard (SQSS)
  - Uniform Network Code (UNC)
- 2. This notice excludes proposed modifications to the Codes that are related to National Security. The Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero will act as the Relevant Authority<sup>2</sup> for such proposed modifications and will publish a separate notice accordingly.

- 3. We are proposing these modifications to implement consequential changes to the Codes that are required to reflect an Independent System Operator and Planner<sup>3</sup> and the regulatory changes to establish its regulatory framework; when created, the ISOP will be designated by the Secretary of State under 162 of the Energy Act 2023 and hold an Electricity System Operator licence<sup>4</sup> and a Gas System Planner licence<sup>5</sup>.
- 4. The effect of the proposed modifications is to implement changes to the Codes to ensure they are coherent with the establishment of the ISOP and other changes to the regulatory framework in accordance with its statutory functions, duties and licence conditions.

- 7. All consultation responses are normally published on Ofgem's website. However, if you do not wish your response to be made public then please clearly mark it as not for publication. We prefer to receive responses in an electronic form so they can be placed easily on Ofgem's website.
- 8. Following consideration of the responses to this consultation, if we decide to make the proposed modifications, they will have effect on the date that designation of the ISOP comes into effect under section 162 of the Energy Act 2023.
