CUSC Modifications Panel Views on Urgency for CMP245 and CMP246 'Introduction of a new 'category 5 Intertripping Scheme' to include System to System intertrips in relation to One-off Charges'.

On 17th June 2015, Tullymurdoch Ltd raised CMP245 and CMP246, with a request for the proposal to be treated as an Urgent CUSC Modification Proposal. The CUSC Modifications Panel ("the Panel") considered CMP45, CMP246 and the associated request for urgency at the CUSC Modifications Panel meeting held on 26th June 2015. This letter sets out the views of the Panel on the request for urgent treatment and the procedure and timetable that the Panel recommends.

Request for Urgency

The Panel considered the request for urgency with reference to Ofgem's Guidance on Code Modification Urgency Criteria. The majority view of the Panel is that CMP245 and CMP246 should NOT be treated as an Urgent CUSC Modification Proposal.

- Noting the relationship to the suggested change to the Grid Code (where
 urgency is not currently an option), requesting urgency on CMP245 and
 CMP246 may shorten the Workgroup process with no apparent benefit.
- The issue is complex and should be developed properly within a Workgroup without rushing the process.

In the discussion, members of the Panel also noted a few concerns over granting urgency, set out below;

- Using an urgent process holds an inherent risk of unintended consequences, which may arise due to there being insufficient time for all aspects of a Modification Proposal to be considered:
- Urgency creates a situation with short consultation periods, as much as possible should be done to inform relevant parties of when these consultations will be issued.

Procedure and Timetable

Having decided not to recommend urgency to Ofgem, the Panel discussed an appropriate process for CMP245 and CMP246. The Panel agreed that CMP245 and CMP246 would require a Workgroup and subject to Ofgem's decision on Urgency should following the standard four month Workgroup process. The Panel requested

for the Modification to be developed as quickly as practicable within this process, with the option of the Workgroup reporting back to the Panel in three months.

The Panel Members agreed that the attached timetable should be used.
